We are bombarded with a constant barrage of information every day, day after day. We are virtually "run over" on the information super highway on the internet or the media with truths, half-truths, and false statements that we find things easy to forget. And there are many things that we should instantly forget or ignore. Our memories are loaded to the max.

It is important to note that the Bible tells us that God likes to forget at times.


How does our omnipotent, omniscient God forget even the slightest things when scripture says that not a sparrow falls to the ground without God knowing? (Matthew 10:29) Yes,God does not remember some things as Isaiah 1:18 tells us, "Come now, let us argue it out, says the Lord, though your sins be like scarlet, they shall be like snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall become like wool." The Bible tells us God will forget our sins when we seek God's forgiveness. God just doesn't forgive, God forgets. God wipes our slate clean. God does not remember.


