

FIRST READING: Isaiah 64:1-9



For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.


INVITATION TO COMMUNION

Fourteen women artists came together for more than a year to share stories and life experiences of racism. Each artist chose a word of importance to her and designed a 10" X 10" canvas around that word. Many of them created additional artwork being displayed around the country.

This month, we feature Kathleen Dustin. Her chosen word is "REPAIR." Kathleen is known as a pioneer in the field of using polymer clay as a medium for art jewelry and fine art. She has taught her use of polymer in Europe, the United States, and Canada. Many museums in those countries feature her work. Her 10" X 10" canvas focuses on a myriad of "patches" used to repair items such as cloth, leather, webbing, stitches, metal, screws, bandages, and tape. She hopes we can repair the inestimable damage from generations of racism.

Her large necklace in the shape of a dagger uses red thread to stitch the dark and light pieces together. It suggests how difficult this repair is and refers to the violence that has occurred. Large photos of Kathleen's art will be on display in the Gathering Space for the month of December. This display will advance our goal to be more inclusive in our artwork here at Zion.
