"Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, 'I have seen the Lord'; and she told them that he had said these things to her." John 20:18

Christ is Risen! He is risen, indeed! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

The lilies and tulips have appeared. The Alleluias are being sung. Even the increased daylight in the evening seems to put an extra pep in our step. The shroud

of cold days and dark winter nights seems to be passing, and in its place bursts forth sunlight, warmer temperatures, and dare I say, springtime!

For my husband and me, the month of April allows us the opportunity to give thanks for the gift of life in the form of our son's birthday. Given that this year will be his 1-year birthday, my mind and emotions have been a bit all over the board. To remember back to those early, early days of the newborn phase as we wandered the wilderness that is being a first-time parent. We drove home from the hospital, a mix of sheer terror and excitement for this new chapter that had been ushered in for us. And for all of the messy diapers and crying and not sleeping well (for anyone) there were glimpses of life in each snuggle and stare at what to us was the most perfect creature that God had ever created before.

Akin to all of this, the texts from Scripture that we will read and hear this month will continue to speak to us the proclamation of new life and resurrection that alone comes from our Lord Jesus Christ. And who can't relate to at least one of the scenarios in our texts?

Perhaps in life you are like Mary and the other women who go to the tomb after Jesus' death. You show up; expecting to put down some flowers, pretty things up a bit, make sure everything is in order. Instead you find out from an angel that the tomb is empty! Jesus is in fact not dead but has been raised! Or even when you do encounter the crucified and risen Lord, you do not recognize it to be him until he calls you by name. For as Scripture has always promised us, you shall never be lost to him.

Or perhaps in life you are like the disciples who hide out in the Upper Room after Jesus' death. Their grief leaves them with fear and feelings of abandonment, and so they retreat to a place that is familiar to them. Instead, they find out from Jesus himself that their Lord has not abandoned them but rather is in their very midst, resurrected from the dead, wounds and all. Bringing peace and forgiveness with them and even asking them for something to eat. And if you don't believe it to be true? Stick your fingers in the marks in his hand and in his side.

And no matter if it was Mary and the women or even the disciples, this news that out of death comes resurrection brought both terror and amazement. And yet, Jesus doesn't leave them in fear. Just as God did not leave my husband and me alone to navigate the peaks and valleys of parenthood. Instead, he comes to each of them to proclaim this good news in both words and in deeds. He shows them his hands and feet. He tells them not to be afraid. To not doubt but *to believe*. God provides to each of us our own little village to navigate the joys and sorrows of this life. May this season of Easter fill you with all hope, joy, and peace and may the Holy Spirit give you the words to speak and the hands and feet to proclaim the good news that Christ is Risen! He is Risen, indeed! Alleluia! Alleluia!
