"I will not leave your orphaned; I am coming to you. In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me; because I live, you also will live." John 14:18-19

While on social media, I scrolled through and stopped at a video reel where the person was asked, "what is the aesthetic of your home?" Then camera then panned around the room to a scene filled with children's toys, play mats, pillow forts and such. The woman responded that her home aesthetic was "toddler chic."

As I looked around at my own living room at the time, with Edward playing with his cars down the hallway, I nodded in solidarity with the woman. My living room could certainly be defined as "toddler chic," with toys and playmats and books and puzzles and a music table, and walkers all claiming their space around the area.

Now, the old me, "the single and never married me," would have panicked at the sight. After all, a house that is cluttered is, to me, a chaotic one. But, the new me? The married with a 1-year-old boy, me? I see the scene and know that all will be organized again after this little one goes to bed. Which is of course exactly what happens each night after Edward goes to bed. A kind of re-setting ritual of reorganizing the living areas in preparation for a new day ahead tomorrow. (I've also learned that my attempts to clean up toys while said little one is awake, only amount to him undoing all of my hard work in real time.)

Because, as much as we all may enjoy our ways of doing things or how things should be whether that is around our homes or workspaces, we also know that there is an even greater gift in having another around, even if that other has a different idea as to how things should go. It doesn't matter if that presence is a pet, a spouse, a child, or friend, or whomever your "other" may be in your life. There is a kind of rhythm that is reached between all parties, as each person lives to serve and bring joy to the other, and in so doing experiences a life that is abundantly full.

We were not made to be islands unto ourselves, but rather made to live life in community with one another. It's one of the joys and perks that come from being a part of a church community like Zion. A gathering of people who meet at least once a week (sometimes multiple times during the week) either in-person or over Zoom for worship, or Sunday School and confirmation, bible study, or meetings.

And while we know that our own human-formed communities aren't perfect and can be susceptible to back-biting, hurt feelings, cliques, and the like, God promises that he will be with us, always. Both when we are part of our communities as well as when we are apart from our communities, such as we have been off and on this past year.

For in Christ's incarnation, God so desired to dwell with and even in his creation that you and I can never be alone. And in Christ's death and resurrection, we have been given the proof that nothing in all of creation can ever separate us from him (not even death or the gates of Hell) or from his love, grace, and mercy.

May you during this Easter season (yes, it's still Easter until Pentecost on May 19th) feel, know, and believe that Christ is with you, always. Through good times and in bad. And that because Christ lives, you also will live. For Christ IS risen! He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!


Those dates will be: Sunday, June 2nd Sunday, July 7th Sunday, August 4th Sunday, September 1st
