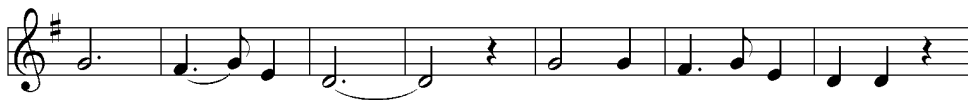





Healing Service Today: We will have a special time of prayer for Healing during worship. This order of worship includes the laying on of hands and anointing with oil for any who wish to take part. A special thanks to Health Ministry team members for their leadership in this ritual.

Hymn of the Day: Philipp Melanchthon (1497-1560), Lutheran theologian, colleague of Martin Luther, and principal author of the *Augsburg Confession*, penned the words for our hymn of the day, “Lord God, to You We Give All Praise”. Originally in Latin, the hymn was specifically written for Michaelmas (the common name for today’s festival). Its text describes the ministry of angels: their constant worship of God and vigilant fight against their foe and ours, Satan. The English translation was completed for the 1880 *Evangelical Lutheran Hymnal* by Emmanuel Cronewett, a Lutheran pastor in Butler, PA. The tune is “Old Hundredth,” one of the best-known melodies from the *Genevan Psalter* and most familiar as the tune for the Doxology.
